As is often necessary in local theatre, they've all pitched in with costuming, finding props and set building, in addition to all their characterisation and line-learning, so a HUGE thank you to everybody involved. A special thankyou to my stage manager, Dierdre, as well as Paul and the STG community for this fantastic opportunity. Last, but by no means least, thank YOU, the audience for your ongoing support of this little theatre of ours!

So sit back, enjoy the show, and remember: "It's pronounced BOO-KAY!"


Hyacinth : Joanne Oliver


