Over the decades writers have presented several suspects with seemingly credible evidence as to their motives and possible psychoses. Subsequent writers give their own proof to refute these theories. This play is based on the ideas presented by Stephen Knight in his book "Jack the Ripper: The Final Solution".

Brian Clemens takes us on a journey in a fast moving dramatisation with a mixture of drama, humour and fear. With a long and illustrious career in television writing, best known for *The Avengers*, Clemens has cleverly taken the known historical facts from the Ripper's infamous reign of terror in Victorian London, and woven a Sherlock Holmes adventure with them. 
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
