Director's Note

As we are celebrating our 50th Anniversary this year, our Artistic Committee decided to celebrate by producing a year of revivals with a play from each of the decades! *Key for Two* was done back in 1991 and I was delighted and privileged when they asked me to direct it this time around.

Written by two very talented master craftsmen of comedy, responsible for many English comedy series on TV, it is well woven together making it a wickedly amusing and hilarious comedy. One of those typical situations of lies and deceit where you the audience are fully aware of each character and what's going on, but the characters on stage haven't got a clue! It simply tells the tale of Harriet, a divorcee, living in an elegant flat in Brighton, who solves her financial struggles by entertaining two married gentlemen callers on different days of the week. However her scheme faces collapse when her friend Anne, whose marriage is tottering, turns up unexpectedly hotly pursued by her husband. One of Harriet's lovers is confined to bed with an injury when the second lover turns up, followed closely by two irate wives in search of itinerate husbands! We hope you enjoy the ensuing complexity of mistaken identity and climax of comic wizardry.

It was such a pleasure to be able to cast this play at the very first audition and a joy working with such a talented and dedicated cast. I take this opportunity of thanking them for working so diligently at their art of comedy timing. I must also thank all the production staff, but especially my Production Assistant and Stage Manager, Ronnii Cook, who has been such a fabulous support. I really couldn't have done it without her to achieve the end result. We all hope you have as many laughs as we have had putting it together.



Chris has been acting and directing for over 55 years having had a passion for live theatre all his life. He has been involved in well over 75 productions in some capacity and enjoys directing and passing on the skills he's leant over the years. Some skills learned from his parents who were both in the entertainment industry. However, his career path was the airline industry, which took him to several overseas postings where he was still able to pursue his hobby wherever he was based.



Over these last 20 years here in Brisbane, we have seen Chris in many different roles at various Community theatres, including Willy Clark in *Sunshine Boys* at Brisbane Arts, Sir Wilfrid Robarts in *Witness for the Prosecution*, and more recent performances here at Sunnybank as Rene in *Allo Allo* and Leslie Bromhead in *No Sex Please We're British*. Chris has many directorial credits to his name over the years and just last August, here at STG, he directed the drama *Pack of Lies*. He hopes you sit back and have a good few laughs at this brilliant comedy.

Key for Two is a fabulous comedy by Dave Freeman, who originally trained as an electrician but went on to co-write with Benny Hill, and John Chapman, who started as a stage manager before teaming up with Ray Cooney to create such genius as Not now Darling and Move over Mrs Markham both of which Lesley has appeared in at STG. That, Lesley says, is bound to leave audiences with quite a few laughter pains.

She now looks forward to bringing the character of Harriet back to life, as part of our 50 year anniversary celebrations. Enjoy!








And so the intrigue begins.


