From the Director

Laughter is still the world's best and most needed medicine - especially for Seniors, Retirees, Pensioners, Baby Boomers and Aged Care residents – who are now familiar with types of humour and forms of theatre that differ greatly from those with which they grew up.

Realising that there was a comedy style gap in the Live Theatre market, Alan Youngson established RED Ticket Comedy Theatre, as he saw the potential for providing clever, witty and slightly "risqué" live shows - for 60 to 80 year olds (currently, 22% of the population and growing weekly) – performed by aspiring and somewhat experienced "Mature Seniors - aged 60 to 80."

Looking for similar aged comedy collaborators, Alan renewed contact with Janet Findlay, an experienced performer, singer and writer with a similar philosophy of entertaining over 60s audiences. In 2016, they co-devised, directed and performed the revue show, *Adventure Before Dementia* starring the Two Merry Gerry-Atrics and The Babbling Trillbillys.




