


This production is dedicated in memory to our great friend Robert Gow

Aside from her love of acting, Bianca is also an avid playwright. In 2010, she was a winner in Queensland Theatre Company's Young Playwrights Program, and participated in QTC's inaugural Youth

Partners Residency. In 2012, her play *Comedy, Comedy* was shortlisted for Playwriting Australia's National Play Festival, and her play *Gumpoldskirchen* was staged by Underground Productions as part of Brisbane's 2013 Anywhere Theatre Festival. Bianca's short play *How Long Have You Been Waiting?* is currently being staged in the 2015 Short + Sweet Festival Sydney. In February this year, Bianca commences postgraduate studies in playwriting at QUT, exploring sibling relationships in Australian Gothic theatre.
